From BELC to EU Local Councillors: Entering a new era

1. The network success in promoting EU values

Welcome to the last bulletin under the BELC flag! The European Commission is boosting the alliance with the local level through the establishment of a single EU Local Councillors network, together with the European Committee of the Regions and following the success of the BELC initiative. Launched in June 2022, BELC has brought together more than 1 100 locally elected politicians from across the EU, fostering collaboration and a shared commitment to the European project.

Through a range of training sessions, workshops, outreach campaigns and networking events, local leaders have gained essential EU-related resources, enabling them to exchange ideas, adopt best practices and develop ground-breaking solutions. In her second-term speech, EC President Ursula von der Leyen emphasised the importance of strengthening local engagement, calling for further expansion of this network of Councillors. In her mission letters to European Commissioners, the President encouraged them to rely *'on our network of EU Local Councillors, and to give more visibility to EU projects [...] on the ground'*.

As of 2025, *the new joint network of EU Local Councillors* will be fully operational. Members will receive a series of revamped products featuring a new visual identity, including a new newsletter, while keeping their privileged access to key EU products and services, website, etc.

Ilion municipality hosts planting event for bee conservation

Greece's Ilion municipality celebrated the 7th International Fascination of Plants Day on 31 May with a bee conservation planting event in collaboration with the University of the Peloponnese. Dubrovnik engaged in successful underwater cleanup

On 21 September, Mayor Mato Franković celebrated World Cleanup Day with an underwater cleanup in Zaton, as part of the **EU Beach Cleanup initiative**. Over half a tonne of waste from the seabed was removed. Supported by a letter of intent signed by him, the event highlighted Dubrovnik's efforts to maintain a cleaner marine environment and demonstrated effective community engagement in environmental protection.

On 4 June, just before the European elections, a panel discussion with party representatives took place at the [Werner-von-Siemens-Gymnasium in Gronau](#), Germany, moderated by local councillor and BELC member Susanne Reinhofer. Over **450 students** from four high schools attended, discussing topics such as the EU's Green Deal, sustainability, climate neutrality and the Ukraine war. The enthusiasm for allowing 16-year-olds to vote was evident among students and party representatives. The event received coverage from local newspapers and German free-to-air television network.

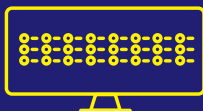
